AUTHORSHIP GUIDELINES FOR APGO ASL PROJECTS

Authorship: include authors based on usual requirements for authorship (see Journal authorship guidelines below). Please consider your local advisor and other collaborators, as appropriate.

For abstracts and posters completed as part of the APGO ASL program, there should be a separate line listing the APGO advisor (APGO Advisor:______) rather than including the APGO advisor in the list of authors.

For further development of the projects (manuscripts, other publication), inclusion of the APGO advisor as a co-author or acknowledgment is up to the scholar and should be based on the continued involvement of the advisor per authorship guidelines.

OBSTETRICS & GYNECOLOGY AUTHOR INSTRUCTIONS

Definition

To qualify as an author of an article published in *Obstetrics & Gynecology*, an individual must have participated sufficiently in the work described to take public responsibility for it. Such participation ordinarily includes:

- Involvement in conception or design of the project
- Important contribution(s) to critical aspects of the conduct of the research
- Drafting the article submitted and revising it for important intellectual content
- Approval of the final form submitted

Participation that does not qualify for authorship includes:

- Data gathering
- Provision of financial or other support

The Editor may request a description of the specific contribution of each of the authors listed. This information may be published with the article.

Authorship Certification

Each author represents and warrants that he or she has fulfilled the definition of authorship given in the Instructions for Authors, participated in this study sufficiently to ensure its integrity and to take public responsibility for it, and approved the Work submitted to Obstetrics & Gynecology. Each author represents and warrants that all persons who contributed to the work reported in the Manuscript are identified as authors or are included in the acknowledgements.
